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Athens Gallery Dio Horia Presents Serbian Artist Maja Djordjevic's Views on Fragility 3 months ago



In the 'Theatre of Memory' exhibition, the young Serbian Artist puts her viewers at the center of the great human epistemological drama.

Dio Horia Gallery in Athens is putting up a solo show by Serbian trailblazing young artist Maja Djordjevic. A total of eight installations and seven video works will be lined up at DH Acropolis from February 4th until March 14th.

Maja's visual vocabulary is deceptively simple. Her childlike figurations and jagged scenography reveal a profound truth found in theatrical deception and resolute beauty contained in the notion of fragility. They hark back to the 16th century and Giulio Camillo's Theatre of Memory project, whereby human knowledge is laid out in space with viewers acting as spectators of the great human drama unfolding before them. Djordjevic's art is a playground for this drama, pinning viewers at the very center of its grandeur.
